

In Memoriam...

Sadly on June 21st, 2007 Peter Liba passed away at his cottage on Lake of the Woods.

Born on May 10th, 1940 in Winnipeg, Liba began his professional career as a print journalist. Peter was involved in numerous charitable and volunteer roles, including Founding Chairman of the Variety Club Telethon, President of the Winnipeg Convention Centre, and Chairman of St. Boniface Hospital. Before his passing Mr. Liba was Chair of the Friends of Upper Fort Garry Steering Committee. A group he brought together to advocate for the restoration and development of the historic site into an interpretive learning centre among other educational uses.

In 1999 Mr. Liba was appointed Lieutenant-Governor of Manitoba, a position he was dedicated to and served with honour until 2004.

Peter Liba is survived by his wife Shirley, children and grandchildren.



"FRIENDS OF UPPER FORT GARRY" UPDATE

Penny McMillan, President, and Cindy Tugwell, Executive Director of Heritage Winnipeg our both official members of the FUFG Steering Committee, and over the last year have been meeting frequently on this very important historic project.

An Expression of Interest on behalf of the Friends was submitted in September 2006 to the City of Winnipeg. This past spring we met with the City to discuss our intentions with the surplus lands at 100 Main Street. Subsequently the City decided to divide the land up into two parcels A & B, in which to our regret, the parcel of land at the corner of Fort and Assiniboine was approved by the Downtown Committee for Crystal builders to develop a 15-storey apartment block.

Since this decision the Steering Committee has been continuing to lobby various stakeholders and politicians to hopefully have this decision reversed. This project has been receiving a lot of media attention over the last several months, and fortunately we have received an immense amount of support from Winnipeggers. We must continue our advocacy role in helping to get The City of Winnipeg to understand the importance of protecting this historic property; the birthplace of Winnipeg. The group will continue over the summer to advocate its protection and look at the option of having the developer relocate.



Heritage Day Luncheon

On Monday February 19th, 2007 from noon to 1:30 p.m., Heritage Winnipeg celebrated *National Heritage Day* with a hot buffet style luncheon at the Marlborough Hotel. 

HERITAGE WINNIPEG AGM 2007


