Heritage Winnipeg celebrated our 27th Annual Preservation Awards with the heritage community on National Heritage Day and Louis Riel Day at the historic Barber House. A special thank you to all the awards winners, nominees, and all other participants! All the nominees and awards winners of this year are as follows:

Commercial Conservation Award NOMINEES:

Ryan/King Building - 104 King Street - this office/warehouse was originally built in 1895 for Thomas Ryan. Behind the original facade is now a parkade.





Scott Block - 272 Main Street - constructed in 1904 as commercial/retail space. It is currently being completely renovated on the interior and restoration to the exterior.





Former Carnegie Library (Winnipeg Archives Building)-380 William Avenue - constructed in 1903-05, this was the first public library constructed for this purpose in Winnipeg, with the assistance from Philanthropist Andrew Carnegie.





Commercial Conservation Awards WINNERS:

Barber House - 99 Euclid Avenue - built in approximately 1865 with Red River construction made up of squared oak logs. The original modest home of pioneer journalist and businessman E.L. Barber.





Residential Conservation Awards WINNER:

Kantor/Moss House - 218 Rosyln Road - the original house was designed by architect James H. Cadham as a Georgian Revival mansion.
