
Heritage Winnipeg Presents Our 27th Annual Preservation Awards Ceremony



THE BARBER HOUSE This is one of Winnipeg's earliest buildings, constructed in 1862 by E.L.Barber (1854-1909) and continuously occupied for over one hundred years. Of American birth, Barber established prosperous mercantile and real estate ventures in the Red River Settlement. He laid out many of the streets in Point Douglas, then the estate of his father-in-law, Robert Logan (1773-1866), a fur trader who became a prominent settler and a councillor of Assinibia. In 1870 Dr. John Schultz fled to this house after escaping Louis Riel's forces at Upper Fort Garry, Barber, Schultz's real estate partner smuggled him out of the colony.

The Standing Policy Committee on Downtown Development, Heritage and Riverbank Management will hear representation on the appeal and adjourned public hearing to its meeting on Monday, February 6, 2012 at 9:00am in the Council building, West Committee room.

Misericordia Hospital Demolition - 99 Cornish Avenue

Demolition work began on January 11, 2012 at the Misericordia Health Complex, the start of a \$43-million development. A wrecking ball was used to cave in the roof of a 106-year-old building, the Maryland South building. The redevelopment will take place in two phases. Phase one involves building a two-storey complex that accommodates the Buhler Eye Centre-- the largest facility of its kind in Western Canada-- and the new University of Manitoba Ophthalmology residency program. The complex's ambulatory diagnostic centre will relocate from the fourth floor to be closer to Urgent Care and Ambulatory Care. The new complex will house PRIME, a new day health centre for the elderly.
